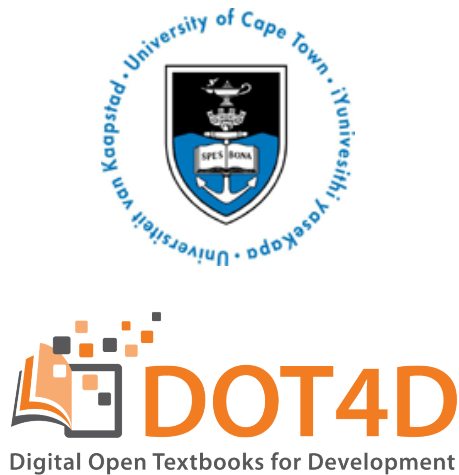




# Siyaphumelela Open Education Resources Workstream 2023



# Context

- Collaborative initiative between open education initiatives at UCT, North-West University and Nelson Mandela University
- UCT represented by the DOT4D initiative in CILT
- Brokered by Tony Lelliot (SAIDE) based on premise that:
  - **learning materials play a critical role in determining student success**
  - **open education makes economic sense and provides means to address social (in)justice in the classroom through student participation and co-creation in knowledge production**
- Leverages work of open education 'champions' at participating institutions and legacy of open education collaboration between the three institutions
- Builds on DOT4D Siyaphumelela service workshops on 'Open Textbooks for Curriculum Transformation and Student Co-Creation' conducted in 2022

# The plan

## FOCUS

A short series of three workshops for all, with a focus on staff and students

- from institutions where open education is emergent or minimally developed,
- with the same staff participating throughout the series so that they can champion openness
- with the overall theme of “**Process is as important as product**”.

## ACTION

- Develop open educational materials from existing teaching and learning materials, including students in scoping, conceptualisation, authorship, quality assurance and publishing of resources.
- Stimulate institutional conversation on the role of openness in addressing social (in)justice in the classroom.
- Explore indicators of student success as relates to materials creation/use and social justice in the classroom.
